- ➤ Once the intermediate level signoff sheet has been completed, including the volunteer commitment, an RSC sailor may use any sailboat 20 feet or under when a Dockmaster is on duty, within sight of the RSC dock (to the south end of Mercer Island).
- RSC Dockmasters and Instructors are authorized to sign off on skills.
- The sailor may sign off on their volunteer service.
- Once the signoff sheet is completed, please send to the Chief Dockmaster (<u>ChiefDockmaster@rentonsailing.org</u>).
 Please keep a copy of the sheet.

Preparing for Intermediate Level Signoff

There are multiple ways to build your knowledge and skills in preparation for getting signed off as an Intermediate sailor, including: taking a small boat sailing class, sailing with other RSC members, reading the US Sailing small boat sailing textbook, and working with Dockmasters or instructors when they are available at the dock or by appointment.

Note: Capsize recovery can be completed by contacting an instructor and making an arrangement to attend a portion of the small boat sailing class. If you have any questions, contact the Lead Instructor.
